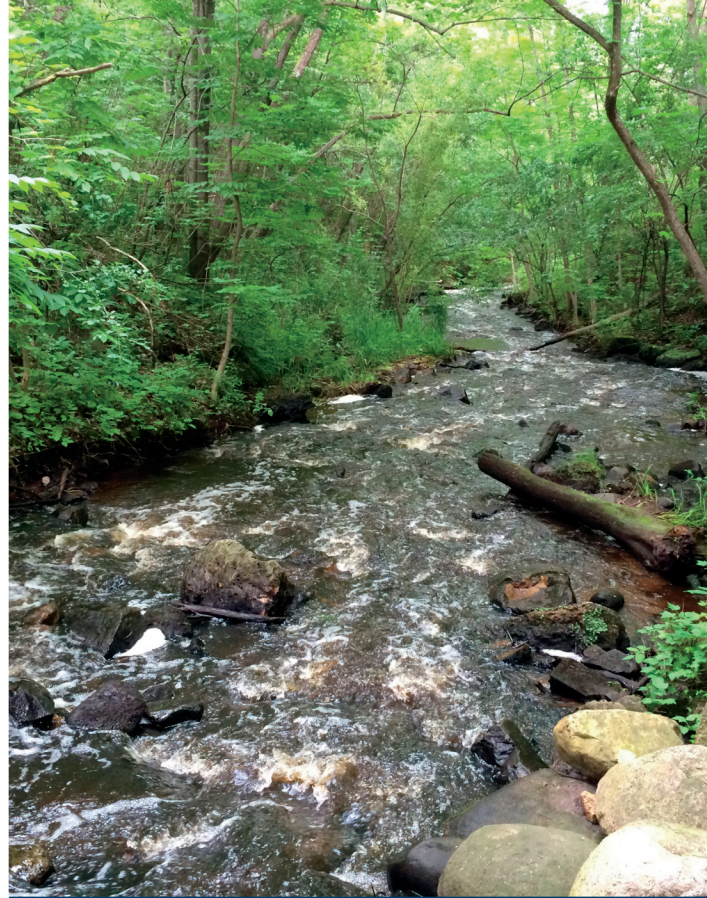
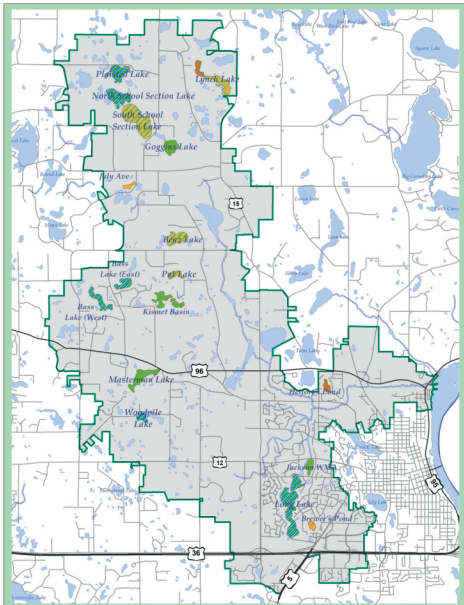


What is the Brown's Creek Watershed District?

The Brown's Creek Watershed is a 28 square mile area of land around Brown's Creek. The creek travels from its headwaters in Grant, south through Stillwater, and outlets east at the St. Croix River. The Brown's Creek Watershed District (BCWD) helps to manage the water resources in this area for water quality, flooding concerns, and ecological improvement.

Providing Input

CAC members assist the board of managers by providing input on watershed plan updates, programs and projects within the district, and outreach materials such as BCWD’s yearly newsletter.

Leading Outreach

Activities include leading tours and “Open Yard” events in the summer months and helping with BCWD’s annual community event each fall.

Conducting Surveys

CAC members collect data on birds and plants at the Brown’s Creek Conservation Area property off 110th St in Grant and assist with restoration activities on-site.

Who is the CAC?

The Citizen's Advisory Committee is a group of watershed residents, **representing a balance of areas across the watershed and a diversity of backgrounds**, that helps advise the board of managers and assists with community outreach. The CAC is open to applicants over age 16, and no experience is necessary.



The CAC Vision

To assist the watershed district managers with public outreach and education to engage residents with the watershed district and to promote behaviors that protect and improve habitat and our natural resources. To review and provide feedback to the managers on budgets, programs, and projects.
